## ▶ ClickView®

Thousands of excellent video clips in the Clickview collection are available for viewing from anywhere with an internet connection. Free smartphone apps are also available.

Here are three simple ways to get there:

1. Simply Google “Clickview Online” and enter your school email if asked, and also your NORMAL school login i.e. the one that you use to log in to your laptop at school every day.
2. If you are in one of Kilbreda Library’s Libguides you will see direct links to the Clickview online site. As above, enter your school email if asked, and also your NORMAL school login i.e. the one that you use to log in to your laptop at school every day.
3. Select the Clickview Online link from the side menu on the College intranet homepage and if asked type in your normal school login.

## Services

### Borrowing

Up to 10 Fiction and Non-Fiction books can be borrowed for four weeks. If you have not finished with the books during that time (and they have not been reserved by other students) then we will renew them.

There are also 2,500 ebooks and audio books that you can download and read/listen to via your laptops, tablets or smartphones. These are on a two week loan and will automatically 'return' after that.

### Printing / Photocopying

You can print or photocopy in black and white (10 cents) or in colour (20 cents). You begin the year with \$20 credit. If you need to 'top-up', come to the circulation desk in the Library and you can pay (cash) to increase your print credit.

### Laminating

We can laminate your work up to size A3 posters. 50c for A4 and \$1.50 for A3

- Kindles with an extensive Classics collection.
- Access to thousands of videos and video clips from home or school via ClickView.
- Phone chargers, calculators, computers, digital cameras, camcorders etc.

### The Age Digital Editions

Provides access to exact replicas of *The Age* newspaper since 2006. Ideal for issues and topics for all year levels.

### Digital Theatre

This database provides excellent performances from the best troupes in the world, along with guides, worksheets, behind the scenes interviews and more.

### edUnlimited

For VCE students, edUnlimited provides online access to ALL ATAR and Neap study guides and practice exams online.

### Echo

Great for current affairs and presenting different sides of issues - good for members of the debating team!

### Ancient and Medieval History Online

Thorough coverage of world history from prehistory through the 1500s, with special Topic Centers on key civilizations and regions, including the ancient Near East, Egypt, Greece, and Rome; ancient and medieval Africa, Asia, and the Americas; and medieval Europe and the Islamic World. Each civilization's history is brought to life through tablet/mobile-friendly videos and slideshows, primary sources, maps and graphs, timelines, suggested readings, and suggested search terms.

### Modern World History Online

World history from the mid-15th century to the present. Thousands of subject entries, biographies, images, videos and slideshows, maps and graphs, primary sources, and timelines combine to provide a detailed and comparative view of the people, places, events, and ideas that have defined modern world history. Focused Topic Centers pull forward interesting entries, search terms, documents, and maps. Videos and slideshow overviews offer a visual introduction to key eras and regions.

### Science Online

Essays, videos, diagrams, definitions, biographies, and experiments. Includes extensive activities and experiments bank which may be filtered by discipline, time and number of participants.

### World Geography and Culture Online

Countries, places, peoples, and geography concepts and skills. Easy access to articles, maps, flags, current news, statistics, a gazetteer, and more! Comprehensive entries on U.S. states and countries of the world, empower the user to examine and understand people, and the various cultures, traditions, and environments of the world in which they live.

### World Religions Online

Covers 15 world religions and traditional spiritual practices, including important topics, spiritual leaders, sacred texts, and holy days and festivals.

The Library staff are ready to help you use these.

There are also guides to help you use these in the Library and on our LibGuides.

## Specialty Areas

### 1. Library Central Desks:

This area has laptop chargers, tables and seating for an entire class. This is the perfect place for research and assignment work.

### 2. Group Research Area:

Set aside specifically for group work. This means that only students who are in a group and are working, should sit here. This helps to keep noise levels at a minimum.

### 3. VCE Study Room:

This room is set aside for silent study by VCE students. It contains a full collection of VCE texts and supporting materials.

### 4. Lounge Area:

This is a comfortable area at the back of the Library for students to debrief after a hard lesson or to relax with friends and a book. This area also has laptop chargers.

### 5. Silent Reading Room:

During class time this is used for book talks. At other times students from Years 7 to 12 may come in and read or study in silence. If you want to talk or share your thoughts with others please find somewhere else to do so.
