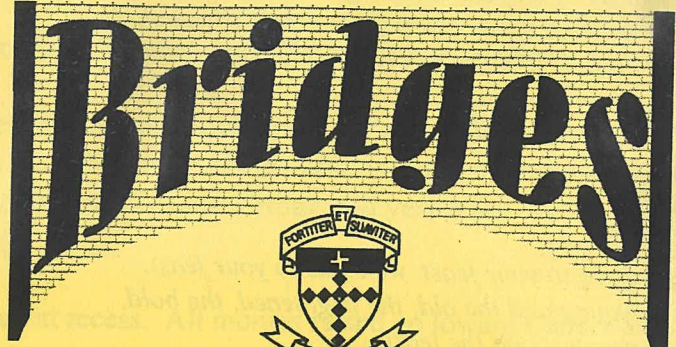

has turned the night into day.*

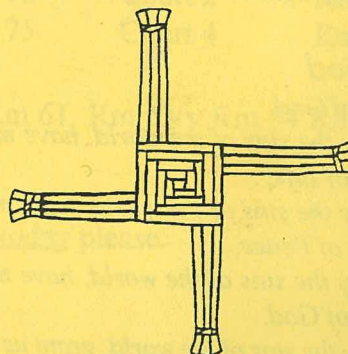
