We're busy removing level crossings

As part of Victoria's Big Build, we're making the Frankston Line level crossing free by removing all 27 of the dangerous and congested level crossings by 2029 and building 17 new stations, improving safety, reducing congestion and allowing more trains to run more often.

Major construction is underway, with crews already removing the boom gates at Neerim and Glen Huntly roads. Work is continuing around the clock to start laying track and pouring the foundations of the new Glen Huntly Station.

The new Glen Huntly Station will feature lowered platforms that improve safety and accessibility for locals. It will also provide better connections between public transport, shops and community spaces.

During this time, level crossing removal project works are also taking place in Parkdale as well as planned maintenance works and upgrades that keep the railway running safely and reliably for passengers.

Getting around Glen Huntly

Glen Huntly Road is closed to vehicles, trams and pedestrians until mid-July.

A Route 67 tram replacement bus is running between Stop 53 Glenhuntly Tram Depot and Carnegie. The Glen Huntly community can also use this bus for free to get around the local area, access the shops and to transfer to/from train replacement bus services.

Pedestrians can cross the train line at:

- Neerim Road*
- Wattle Aveue

*Neerim Road will be closed to vehicles and pedestrians **until late June**.


Route 67 tram impacts

Caulfield Station precinct changes

To enable project works to take place in Caulfield, there will be the following changes in place at Caulfield Station:

Car park closure

- The station car park off Normanby Road is closed **until Friday 28 July**.
- Alternative all-day parking is available at East Malvern Station.
- Passengers requiring accessible parking are advised to use either Ormond or Carnegie stations.

Pedestrian underpass partial closure

- The pedestrian underpass will be partially closed **until Friday 7 July**.
- Pedestrian access between Sir John Monash Drive and Normanby Road will be either via Queens Avenue or via Smith Street.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained between Sir John Monash Drive and platforms 3, 4 and the station ticket office.

Bicycles, dogs (with the exception of animals identified by an Assistance Animal Pass) and surfboards are not allowed on train replacement buses.



Most train replacement buses will be low-floor models to assist passengers.
