

WELCOME TO THE KILBREDA MUSIC COMMUNITY

We invite your child to join, or continue participating in, the vibrant Kilbreda Music community. Our program offers students the opportunity to learn voice or an instrument, to engage in ensembles and special events and learn from invited guests throughout the year.

Why Music Matters

Research consistently shows that learning an instrument benefits students academically, socially and emotionally. Studies reveal that instrumental learners often outperform their peers in language and numeracy, and gains experience in motivation, confidence and self-belief. These benefits are even more pronounced for students from diverse backgrounds. Music also fosters resilience, focus and persistence - skills that last a lifetime.

Wellbeing and Lifelong Value

Learning music enhances wellbeing through improved self-esteem, discipline, emotional capacity and identity development. It relieves tension, boosts immunity and offers a creative outlet that brings joy and connection throughout life's seasons. Unlike many activities, music remains accessible and meaningful at any age.

- A variety of ensembles options to support and enhance private tuition
- Tutor recitals where students perform to family and friends
- An annual Music Residency day camp with invited guest conductors and workshops
- · Mid year Music By Candlelight and end of year Christmas Concerts with specialist lighting and sound
- Incursion opportunities with visiting performers
- Performance opportunities and pathways to VCE Music and beyond
- · A friendly, fun and supportive music community that develops friendships.

PRIVATE LESSON ARRANGEMENTS WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Private tuition occurs during school hours on a rotating timetable using a unique scheduling software program, ensuring students do not miss the same class each week.
- Fixed lesson times and lessons before school or during break times can be requested, subject to tutor availability and school resources.
- Lessons are scheduled around year-level and whole-school events to minimise disruption.

If a lesson time overlaps with sport, assessments, small group activities, excursions or other commitments, students are encouraged to let their tutor know early in the week so an alternative time can be arranged. A little personal organisation will help keep everything running smoothly.

Lesson timetables are emailed to families each Friday afternoon. If a change is needed, please contact your tutor by Monday morning of the following week.

For unexpected absences (such as illness), tutors appreciate being notified by 8.00am on the day of the lesson so they can reschedule where possible. If notice isn't received by this time, the lesson may not be able to be made up.

Fees are billed through family Edstart accounts, offering a range of convenient payment options.

Ensembles

All students enrolled in the music program are expected to actively participate in at least one ensemble. This involvement is a core part of their musical development and fosters collaboration, performance experience and community engagement. While students may choose from a variety of ensembles, those studying piano, percussion or guitar are especially encouraged to consider joining the choir or contributing to the percussion sections of the Concert Band or Orchestra, where their skills can be uniquely valuable.

Some ensembles, such as Orchestra and Jazz Combo, require auditions and are suited for students with prior intermediate to advanced experience. To ensure a balanced workload and meaningful participation, students may join a maximum of two ensembles. This structure allows for both depth and variety in musical exploration while maintaining a manageable commitment alongside other academic responsibilities.

Amanda Hargreaves

Vocals

Amanda graduated with a Master of Music (Opera Performance) from the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music in 2023. During her studies, she collaborated with Victorian Opera, understudying 'Olivia' in Schubert's *The Friends of Salamanca* (2021) and performing as the 'Squirrel Monkey' in Joe Twist's *The Grumpiest Boy in the World* (2023) at Arts Centre Melbourne.

Her operatic roles include 'Titania' (*The Fairy Queen*), 'Papagena' (*Die Zauberflöte*) and Venus (*Venus and Adonis*), with additional study of 'Despina' (*Cosí Fan Tutte*, 2023).

Amanda recently won First Prize in the Royal Melbourne Philharmonic (RMP) Aria Competition (2025). Other accolades include finalist in the MCM Aria/Concerto Competition (2021), Opera Scholars Australia Aria Competition (2021), National Liederfest (2022), Ringwood Eisteddfod Aria Finals (2025), runner-up in the Boroondara Vocal Championship (2025) and third prize in the RMP Aria Competition (2024).

Passionate about sacred music, she has appeared as soprano soloist in Saint-Saëns' *Christmas Oratorio* with Victoria Chorale (2022), *Sing Noel* and Tchaikovsky's *Sacred Music* with the Tudor Choristers (2024), and in concerts with Kew Philharmonic, including Zipoli's *Vespers of St Ignatius* and *Stella Splendens*. Most recently, she joined them for Vivaldi's *Gloria*.

Vocals

Jennie Mortimer holds a Diploma in Music Theatre and Voice from Trinity College London, graduating with honours. She also completed a Diploma in Dance at Melbourne's Dance Factory and studied acting at the Howard Fine Studio. With over 20 years of experience teaching in schools, Jennie brings a wealth of knowledge and passion to her students.

She loves teaching a wide range of styles, including musical theatre, contemporary pop and classical music, believing in the importance of exposing students to diverse genres. Jennie's love for music began early - her parents were professional orchestral players - and at 15, she appeared on television in a talent quest, winning her heat. This experience sparked her lifelong passion for performing.

Her favourite piece to perform is 'The Winner Takes It All' from *Mamma Mia*, and her dream collaboration would be with Cynthia Erivo, renowned for her powerful vocals and role in *Wicked The Movie*. One of her most memorable moments was being cast in her first professional musical, *Guys and Dolls*, at just 18 years old.

A graduate of the Australian National University and prize winner in the prestigious Ike Isaacs Jazz Guitar Competition, Chris has performed with many pre-eminent musicians in the Australian jazz scene including Dale Barlow, Carl Dewhurst, James Sherlock, Mat Jodrell, Warwick Alder, Carl Mackey, Ben Hanlon, Ben Robertson, Mark Fitzgibbon, Brendan Clark, Anton Delecca, Tom Lee, Danny Fisher, Emma Gilmartin, Con Campbell, John Mackey, John Morrison, Jacki Cooper and Gary France, establishing himself as a stylistically flexible and diverse performer.

Chris has since relocated to Melbourne and is not only becoming an in-demand player in the local scene, but also one of Melbourne's most sought after private tutors.



Bernardo Soler

Classical Guitar

Born in the Philippines, Bernardo Soler began guitar lessons with his brother and earned a Bachelor of Music in Classical Guitar from the University of Santo Tomas (1989) under Mario Rodriguez. He later studied at Melbourne's Melba Conservatorium with Jochen Schubert (1992).

Bernardo has achieved significant success in international competitions, including first prizes in the Concurso de Guitarra (1981) and the National Music Competition for Young Artists (1981, 1987), Grand Prix at the 6th Philippine Guitar Competition (1982) and has represented the Philippines at prestigious events in Chile (1988) and Paraguay (1994).

He has performed extensively across the Philippines, Indonesia, Chile, Paraguay, the USA, Japan, Germany, Singapore and Australia.



Rebecca Harkin

Drums and Percussion

Bec Harkin has always had a passion for percussion, particularly the drumkit. Her musical journey began with years of piano study, giving her a strong foundation in musical knowledge, before taking up drums at the start of secondary school. She was fortunate to be mentored by one of Melbourne's leading drum teachers, which shaped her skills and love for performance.

Bec has performed in a wide range of ensembles, from symphony orchestras and brass bands to jazz groups. A highlight of her career was playing at Hamer Hall on her 18th birthday. She has also enjoyed performing in numerous musical theatre productions, including Kilbreda College's *Legally Blonde*, *Hairspray* and *42nd Street*.

As a long-standing member of the Kilbreda College music team, Bec has taught for many years and conducted the Orchestra and Senior Ensemble and led Percussion Ensembles. Her teaching philosophy focuses on equipping students with essential musicianship skills, such as reading notation, while encouraging individual creativity and fostering a life-long love of music.



Eugenie Lyons

Violin/Viola

Eugenie Lyons has been teaching violin and viola for five years and has a life-long love of music. Growing up in a musical family with a father who played piano, Eugenie began learning violin in Year 2 and added viola in Year 8. Her passion for music and the sense of community found in ensembles inspired her to pursue a career in music.

Outside of teaching, Eugenie performs across a variety of genres, including classical and musical theatre. Some of her most memorable experiences include playing in the orchestra for Wagner's *Ring Cycle* with Melbourne Opera and performing in *Come From Away* with CLOC Musical Theatre, where the band appeared on stage for several songs.

Eugenie teaches to share her love and knowledge of music, aiming to help students experience the same joy she has found through learning and performing.



Toby Owens

Cello

Toby Owen's musical journey started with a few false starts - recorder in Year 3, guitar for a year, and even piano in Year 6 - before discovering his true passion for the cello in Year 7 through his school's music program. He has been playing and loving the instrument ever since!

Toby primarily performs classical music but enjoys exploring modern arrangements with fellow musicians. One of his favourites is the electrifying *Thunderstruck* duet by 2CELLOS. KILBREDA COLLEGE ENSEMBLES

Kilbreda Chorale

(Friday mornings: 8.00am to 8.50am)

Open to all students and completely free, the Chorale regularly performs at school and community events, leading Masses and celebrations. Vocalists, guitarists and piano players are welcome to join as singers. Students learn to sing in two or three part harmony, develop vocal technique and build lasting friendships.

Wind Ensemble

(Lunchtime Rehearsals: exact day TBC)

A welcoming group for beginner to intermediate wind players to learn the fundamentals of ensemble playing, develop confidence and enjoy making music together.

Flute Choir

(Lunchtime Rehearsals: exact day TBC)

An exciting new ensemble in 2026 for flautists to explore rich harmonies and ensemble flute repertoire. Students will develop tone blending and musical expression while performing a variety of styles from classical to contemporary.

Beginner Strings

(Lunchtime Rehearsals: Semester 2 only)

An introductory ensemble for string players to build essential skills for group performance, focusing on teamwork and foundational techniques.

Percussion Ensemble

(Monday Lunchtime Rehearsals)

Designed for beginner to intermediate percussionists, this group offers opportunities to strengthen rhythm, refine technique and experience collaborative ensemble playing on a variety of instruments and everyday items!

Junior Guitar Ensemble

(Lunchtime Rehearsals: exact day TBC)

The Junior Guitar Ensemble offers students the chance to play together, build confidence and develop essential ensemble skills. Rehearsals focus on rhythm, harmony and teamwork while exploring a variety of musical styles. Open to beginner and entry-level guitarists, the ensemble performs at school concerts and events throughout the year.

Concert Band

(Monday mornings: 7.45am to 8.40am)

For beginner to intermediate wind and percussion players. Vocalists, guitarists and piano players are also welcome to join with the playing of percussion parts. This ensemble plays a variety of styles of music including jazz, pop, musical theatre and symphonic music. This ensemble debuted at the Victorian School Music Festival in 2025, earning a Silver Award. Wind and percussion players are in high demand. Join and be part of something exciting!

String Ensemble

(Thursday mornings: 7.45am to 8.40am)

Open to all string players, this ensemble focuses on developing ensemble skills and musicality. Students perform a mix of classical repertoire and popular movie themes, learning how to play in sync with others and listen across the group for balance and tuning. Participation in String Ensemble is an excellent stepping stone for students who aspire to join the Kilbreda Orchestra in the future, as it builds confidence, technical ability and ensemble awareness. The String Ensemble will compete in the Victorian School Music Festival in 2026, giving students the chance to showcase their progress and perform to a panel of adjudicators.

AUDITIONED ENSEMBLES



Senior Vocal Ensemble

(Friday mornings: 8.00am to 8.50am)

This advanced extension ensemble is open to students currently enrolled in the Kilbreda Chorale who have prior singing experience at Kilbreda. Membership is capped at eight students with strong vocal ability. The ensemble focuses on challenging repertoire, including classical works, musical theatre pieces, and a cappella arrangements, providing an opportunity for students to develop advanced ensemble skills.

Kilbreda Orchestra

(Tuesday mornings: 7.45am to 8.40am)

For advanced string, wind and percussion players. The Orchestra tackles challenging repertoire in complex keys including movie soundtracks, classical works and music from other cultures. Members must demonstrate strong tuning, sightreading in keys up to four sharps/flats and commit to regular rehearsals.

Kilbreda Jazz Combo

(8.00am exact day TBC)

Ideal for guitarists, drummers and wind players ready to explore funk and jazz. Students learn improvisation and ensemble skills. Prior experience is required and we will be planning opportunities for this group to participate in external festivals in the future pending ensemble progress.

32 × 30-minute lessons: \$2,050 per year (recommended for optimum student progress in Years 7 - 9)

32 × 45-minute lessons: \$2,910 per year (recommended for students in Year 10 and/or AMEB Grades 4 and above)

32 × 60-minute lessons: \$3,770 per year (recommended for VCE students and AMEB Grades 6 and above)

Instrument Hire

\$300 per year (flat fee, non-refundable)

Important Notes

- Students continuing on string or wind instruments beyond Years 7 and 8 are encouraged to consider purchasing their own instrument.
- Bassoon is only available for hire through external providers.
- Guitar, piano and percussion students must have their own instrument at home.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Please note the below conditions of learning an instrument at the College.

- 1. To begin individual music tuition, families must complete the Music Tuition Application Form and tick the box for instrument hire, if applicable. Once submitted, families will be contacted with details about the assigned teacher and lesson timetable access.
- 2. Each student will receive 32 individual lessons per year. These lessons are typically distributed as eight per term, and students are expected to complete all 32 lessons by the end of the school calendar year.
- 3. Lessons are provided with the understanding that students are committing to a full year of tuition. Instrumental hire charges are non-refundable.
- 4. Year 12 students may nominate the number of lessons they wish to complete due to exams and an earlier finish to their school year.
- 5. All music program fees will be added to standard tuition fees and billed in accordance with families' Edstart payment plans.
- 6. Students undertaking AMEB or VCE examinations, or requiring accompaniment for rehearsals and performances, may incur additional fees which will be added to family school accounts as required throughout the year.
- 7. All students enrolled in the music program are expected to participate in at least one ensemble. This involvement supports musical growth, collaboration and performance experience.
- 8. Students learning piano, percussion or guitar are encouraged to join the Choir or contribute to the percussion sections of the Concert Band or Orchestra.
- 10. Entry into Orchestra, Senior Vocal Ensemble and Jazz Combo is by audition and requires prior intermediate to advanced experience.
- 11. Students may participate in a maximum of two ensembles to ensure a balanced workload.

 Students are expected to attend all scheduled lessons and must check their lesson times, which are sent via email by staff each Friday for the following week. If unsure of their lesson time, students must contact performingarts@kilbreda.vic.edu.au
- 12. If a student is unable to attend a lesson due to scheduled events such as exams, school excursions or medical appointments, they must notify their tutor directly by 9.00am on the Monday of that week. Failure to notify will result in forfeiture of the lesson fee.
- 13. In the case of unexpected illness, the tutor must be contacted directly by 8.00am on the day of the lesson, preferably the day before. A maximum of four lessons per year may be rescheduled due to illness, at the discretion of the tutor. If sufficient notice is not provided, the lesson fee will be forfeited.
- 14. Lessons missed due to holidays taken during the school term cannot be rescheduled and will be forfeited.
- 15. Please note that non-attendance at ensemble rehearsals due to homework completion, study revision or preparation for assessments is not considered an acceptable reason for missing choir rehearsals or performances. These activities should be scheduled around ensemble commitments, which are known in advance and form part of student personal organisation and responsibilities.
- 16. Students must bring their instrument, music, notebook and student planner to each lesson. If a student forgets their instrument or is unable to play due to physical impairment, they are still expected to attend and participate in alternative skill development such as theory, musicianship and aural training.
- 17. The College has a limited number of instruments available for hire. Hired instruments must be returned at the end of the year or upon discontinuation of lessons. Students are encouraged to purchase their own instrument, where possible, especially by the end of Year 8.
- 18. Parents who wish to purchase an instrument for their child are strongly encouraged to consult the tutor for advice on suitable products and brands. The College and tutors are not responsible for any suboptimal instrument purchases.
- 19. Trial lessons may be arranged with one or more instrumental teachers at the standard lesson rate. These lessons will be billed via the student's school account. Families should contact the Learning Leader: Music to organise a trial.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 20. Group lessons are not available. However, individual lesson times may occasionally be combined for students preparing ensemble items.
- 21. Enrolment needs to be renewed each school year in order for students to continue in the program.
- 22. To cancel tuition, parents must notify both the Learning Leader: Music and the music tutor in writing **at least eight lessons prior to the intended end date.** This notice period honours the contractual agreement with tutors and allows time to adjust teaching schedules.
- 23. Requests for cancellation due to extenuating circumstances such as prolonged illness or injury will be reviewed by the Learning Leader: Music.
- 24. If parents wish to discuss their child's progress, they should contact the instrumental teacher directly via their Kilbreda email. Please note that instrumental staff work limited hours due to commitments at other schools.
- 25. Lessons are scheduled on a rotating timetable during school hours to minimise disruption to the same academic class. In most cases, students are allocated a different time each fortnight.
- 26. A limited number of before school, recess and lunch fixed times may be available with tutors pending their availability. Please contact them directly to make these requests.
- 27. **Please note:** All music accessories and books required for the students' tuition are at the expense of the parents/carers.
